## Vote-by-mail ballots for Nov. 5 election on the way starting Monday

Approximately 129,000 vote-by-mail ballots will be mailed to voters starting Monday (Oct. 7) for the consolidated general election on Nov. 5. Ballots should arrive in mailboxes by the end of the week. Voted ballots must be received by the Registrar of Voters office by 8 p.m. on Nov. 5 to be counted in the upcoming election.

Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned through the postal service or deposited in vote-by-mail drop-off boxes at participating city clerk offices. Drop-off locations can be found on the registrar's website at [www.voteinfo.net](http://www.voteinfo.net). A 24-hour drop box also is available outside the main entrance of the registrar's office at 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside. Vote-by-mail ballots may also be dropped off at any polling place within Riverside County before 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Voters have until Oct. 29 to request a vote-by-mail ballot by completing the request form on the back of their sample ballot or by using the application form on the Registrar of Voters' website at [www.voteinfo.net](http://www.voteinfo.net). The forms may be returned by mail or facsimile to (951) 486-7272.

Early voting at the Registrar of Voters office begins Monday (Oct. 7) and runs through Nov. 5. Early voting also will be offered at the Palm Springs Public Library at 300 S. Sunrise Way, 92262 on Oct. 26 from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** The Nov. 5 election is not a countywide election, so some areas of the county are not included in the election. Call the registrar's office at (951) 486-7200 if you have any questions about your eligibility to vote.
