Vote-by-mail ballots for Riverside's June 4 election on the way to voters starting Monday

Approximately 80,000 vote-by-mail ballots will be mailed to voters in the City of Riverside next week for the June 4 general municipal mail ballot election for the city's Wards 1, 3, 5 and 7 city council seats. Ballots will be sent starting Monday, May 6, and should arrive in mailboxes by the end of the week. To be counted, completed ballots must be received at the Registrar of Voters office no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day, or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day. Because it is solely a mail-ballot election, there will be no established polling places.

Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned through the postal service or deposited in designated vote-by-mail drop-off boxes. Vote-by-mail drop-off locations and hours of operation can be found on the registrar's website at www.voteinfo.net. A 24-hour drop box is available outside the main entrance of the registrar's office at 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside.

Early voting at the Registrar of Voters office begins Monday, May 6, and continues Monday through Friday, excluding county holidays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The registrar's office will be open to voters on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The June 4 general municipal mail ballot election is not a countywide election, so some areas of the county are not included in the election. If you have any questions about your eligibility to vote, please contact the registrar's office at (951) 486-7200.
