Vote-by-Mail ballots for November 5 general election mailed

Approximately 77,000 vote-by-mail ballots will to be mailed to voters starting today, October 7, for the general election on November 5. Completed ballots must be received at the Registrar of Voters Office or any polling place within Riverside County no later than the close of polls on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than three days after Election Day to be counted.

Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned through the postal service or deposited in vote-by-mail drop-off boxes at participating city clerks' offices. City clerk drop-off locations and hours of operation can be found on the registrar's website at www.voteinfo.net. A 24-hour drop box is available outside the main entrance of the registrar's office at 2724 Gateway Drive in Riverside. Vote-by-mail ballots also may be dropped off at any polling place within Riverside County before 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Voters have until October 29 to request a vote-by-mail ballot by completing the request form on the back of their county voter information guide, or by using the application form on the Registrar of Voters website at www.voteinfo.net. The request forms may be returned by mail or by facsimile to (951) 486-7272.

Early voting at the Registrar of Voters Office begins today, October 7, and continues Monday through Friday (excluding county holidays), from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The hours will be 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, October 26 and Saturday, November 2. The registrar's office will be open to voters on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Early voting will also be offered October 25-26 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Palm Springs City Hall, 3200 E Tahquitz Canyon Way in Palm Springs

and October 25 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Blindness Support Services, 3696 Beatty Dr in Riverside.

The November 5 election is not a countywide election, so some areas of the county are not included in the election. If you have any questions about your eligibility to vote, please contact the registrar's office at (951) 486-7200.

If you want to register, update your address or change your political party preference you must complete a voter registration application and submit it by October 21. You can register online at registertovote.ca.gov or request a paper application by calling (951) 486-7200.
